40th Anniversary of The Founding of the Church

On Sunday January 27, 1985, the James River Presbytery held a worship service in our building here at 3000 Grove to officially declare to the world that All Saints Reformed Presbyterian Church was a "particularized" congregation of the Presbyterian Church in America.

Pastors and Ruling Elders from around the region came to install Howard Griffith as pastor of this new church and to install Ruling Elders: Doug Westcott, Greg Brooks, Phil Scott, Gary Witthoeft, and Deacons: Al Yancey, Lamont Wade, Tim Cox, and Mark Barnard. Some of the men from the Presbytery included Pastors Bill Harrell, Ed Clowney, and Charlie Drew, as well as Ruling Elder Dick Chewning. 101 souls (communicant and non-communicant) were members of the church that day. Thirteen are still members of the church: Carolyn Gile, Rick Hutton, Bill & Jane Ivey, Ann Petty Johnson, Scott & Debbie Robinson, Tom Shea, Lamont & Terrill Wade, Al & Sue Yancey, and Janet Zeigler.

Rev. Charlie Drew preached at the worship service that "particularized" us as a congregation. He was a pastor in Charlottesville, VA at the time. He has returned to preach for us on this our 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary. Charlie Drew is a pastor, teacher, and author. He pastored churches in Charlottesville, Long Island, and Manhattan before retiring in 2017 from Emmanuel Presbyterian Church, which he founded in 2000. Since then, Charlie has been teaching seminarians and pastors under the auspices of Redeemer City to City, focusing on preaching and calling. For two years he served as interim lead preacher at Redeemer East Side in Manhattan. Charlie's books include Surprised by Community: Republicans and Democrats in the Same Pew, The Ancient Love Song: Finding Christ in the Old Testament, and A Journey Worth Taking: Finding Your Purpose in This World. He was educated at Harvard and Westminster Theological Seminary (Philadelphia). Father of two and grandfather of four, Charlie lives in New York with his wife Jeannie.

## Confession of Faith \*

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of his Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father; by whom all things were made; who for us and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate; he suffered and was buried; and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father; and he shall come again, with glory, to judge both the living and the dead; whose kingdom shall have no end.

As instituted by our Lord, wine is the element used in the Lord's Supper to show forth His Blood on our behalf (Mark 14:23-25).

If, however, for reasons of conscience or health, you are unable to participate using wine, grape juice is provided on the outer ring of the tray.

Gluten-free wafers are provided on each bread tray.

And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son; who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified; who spoke by the prophets; and we believe in one holy catholic and apostolic church; we acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins; and we look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

## John 17:20-26

## "Surprising and Winsome Community"

"The church that is to be one in the Spirit, united to Jesus Christ, and one in the faith, holding to the purity of the apostolic gospel, must also be God's holy people on earth, growing in likeness to Christ and transcending worldly divisions as the beginning of the new humanity in Christ." (Edmund Clowney, *The Church*)

"I am convinced that the church can be the safest place in the world to argue about politics. I am also persuaded that it must be." (Charles Drew, *Surprised by Community*)

"Watch and listen to politically polarized commentary today, and you will see that it is more contemptuous than angry, overflowing with sneering, mockery, and disgust. Studies on the subject have shown that, whereas simple anger is characterized by short-term attack responses but long-term reconciliation, contempt is characterized by rejection and social exclusion in both the short-term and the long-term. Polarization, and thus, contempt, leads to permanent enmity." (Arthur Brooks, *New York Times*)
